Study in China!

SOE students (sophomore through graduate level) have an opportunity to study in China under an agreement between UNM and Shanghai Jiao Tong University, and there is funding available that can help offset expenses for successful applicants.

The UNM-SJTU Exchange Agreement enables students to study in Shanghai either for a semester or a year. The application deadline is October 1 for spring 2011.

Participants experience a rich culture on the other side of the globe while gaining valuable experience relevant to global careers. Shanghai is the largest city in China, and Shanghai Jiao Tong University is one of China's top five universities. In addition, the Asia headquarters of many major companies, including Microsoft and Intel, are in the nearby Zizhu industrial park.

You pay your regular tuition at UNM, and you can apply for campus housing at SJTU. Also, if you apply and are accepted for a UNM Regents International Study Grant, you can offset some expenses. Students take your usual full load of degree courses (taught in English) and conduct research co-advised by SJTU professors, and you can also take Chinese culture courses. Questions?
