

HOLDS

Definition of a Hold: A hold means the student is restricted from enrolling in classes and/or obtaining academic transcripts at UNM. Bursar's, Admission's, Advisement are some of the offices that place holds.

Academic Holds: Placed to ensure you seek out support, remain on track with your degree and reach your goals, every semester. These require you attend one of the workshops, one-on-one advisement sessions with your advisor, or faculty mentor as outlined above.

Holds and corresponding workshops help you think about the BIGGER picture and more HOLISTICALLY about your education. Advisement is more than choosing a schedule. You have more questions than "what classes should I take next?" and we recognize that! We use workshops to provide a foundation to get you thinking and exploring. One on one advisement times help you continue to grow and ask the in depth questions you have.
